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#### About this month's webcast:

The importance of preventive healthcare for those with spinal cord injuries is well known. However, research suggests that patients living with SCI may have limited physical access to health care and receive fewer preventative services than able-bodied patients. In addition, many individuals feel that their medical teams do not adequately understand disabilities and they rely on physiatrists to provide primary care services.

This lecture will discuss a co-operative model of an interdisciplinary primary care clinic at Frazier Rehab Institute, Kentucky Regional Spinal Cord Injury Model System. This model of primary care offers patients a fully accessible facility and professionals who are experienced with spinal cord injury care and management, ensuring that all patients can receive thorough and coordinated care.
